DEVA Group Hears About Around-the-World EV Adventure

Attendees at the DEVA (Davis EV Association) meeting on August 8 heard Don Christian describe his travels during the EV race "Around the World in 80 Days." Don's team passed through China, Kazakhstan, Russia, and Romania on the way to Europe, with very long stretches between charging stations. The team became expert at fabricating cables that allowed them to charge from local electrical sources.



A second speaker, Elizabeth Turnbull of PG&E, described the company's program to install 7,500 Level 2 EV charging stations at condominiums, apartment buildings, and workplaces across Northern and Central California.

Hanlees Davis Kia brought a 2018 plug-in hybrid Niro vehicle to the meeting for show and tell.

New Charging Stations

Two Volta charging stations have been installed at Delta Shores, a mixed-use development with shopping, restaurants, and theaters in South Sacramento, just off I-5 (see the location here).

Tenant's Right to Install a Charging Station Is Strengthened

California law provides a framework for California tenants to request permission from their landlords to install electric vehicle charging stations on the landlord's property. California Civil Code 1947.6 (established by Assembly Bill (AB) 2565, Muratsuchi), requires landlords to give permission for charging station installation, but provides an exception for properties subject to rent control. Assembly Bill 1796 (Muratsuchi), which will become law on January 1, 2019, will remove this exemption for rent-controlled properties.

UC Davis ITS - Global EV Sales are Accelerating, But ...

While the global PEV market has been growing for several years, its continued expansion, particularly in the U.S., is threatened by potential trade wars and a rollback of EV-favorable policies. In 2017, the global PEV market grew by 65%, hitting 1.2 million in sales. During the first half of 2018, sales grew at an even faster pace, and the total number of PEVs worldwide is over 3.5 million. Sacramento Places Fifth in Study of National EV Adoption

The latest ICCT study looked at EV sales in 50 cities across the United States and tracked the percentage of electric cars sold in those cities. The top five EV cities were all in California, with Sacramento in fifth place at 3%. The report correlates adoption rates with various causes. You can see the report here.

Autonomous Cars To Be Tested on Sacramento Streets



Sacramento has signed a deal with Phantom Auto to use down-town streets for tests of autonomous vehicles that are monitored by remote "drivers" from computers in Silicon Valley. The deal could prepare Sacramento to be the first city in California where autonomous vehicles with no occupants are tested in traffic on public streets.

Phantom Auto will initially test two designated routes provided by the city. One route will loop past City Hall, the state Capitol, and the convention center. The other will link the Sacramento State campus to the 65th Street light rail station.

Driverless Cars at Sleep Train Arena

Nuro, a tech startup from Mountain View, has been testing its autonomous car prototype in the parking lot of Sleep Train Arena in Natomas. Nuro has been developing a driverless electric vehicle for delivering goods that range from groceries to pizzas. CARB Plans Emissions-Free Public Transit



The California Air Resources Board (CARB) has issued an outline showing how California can transition to the use of zero-emissions buses. For large bus fleet operators (those with more than 100 buses), 25% of new purchases would have to be battery-electric or fuel cell buses by 2023. The quota would rise to 50% in 2026 and 100% by 2029. See more information here.
